DESCRIPTION

DOBER LIDSKY MATHEY's relationship with Carleton College spans three presidencies and almost three decades. During that time we have assisted with the preparation of two campus plans, including "Navigating the Nineties", as well as numerous facility studies and space programming assignments.

Projects include facility studies and space programs for two science facilities, the renovation of Olin Hall of Science and the construction of a new science building Hulings Hall, and the Center for Mathematics and Computing. We also assisted in the preparation of program and renovation concepts and expansion of the arts center, Boliou Hall and Gould Library. We also programmed the Johnson/Alumni Guest House complex, a new dining facility and the Recreational Center. A more operationally oriented project was a strategic assessment and estimate of correcting deferred maintenance deficiencies.

One of our early projects on campus was the transformation of a vacated early 20th century gym into a contemporary, late 20th century student center complete with bookstore, café, meeting rooms, recreation/games area, post office, and classrooms. Sayles-Hill quickly became the social center of the campus and is going strong in the first decade of the 21st century.

Most of the numerous projects that we planned and programmed have come to fruition including expansion of the sciences, a new dining hall, student housing, a renovation and expansion of the library, a new math computer center and expansion of the Arts.
