THE PROJECT

DOBER LIDSKY MATHEY (DLM) was asked to assist the University in the development of a campus plan to guide development of the main campus of this multi-campus, urban university.

CHALLENGE

The study's purpose was to establish a framework for continued facilities development to better support a student population of approximately 7,700 students, undergraduate and graduate, served on this Saint Paul campus.

SOLUTION

A participatory planning process fostered collegial discussions that informed the preparation of an effective, flexible plan for continuing improvements. A campus plan agenda was developed to include additional student housing, recreational space, a new campus center, and academic space, as well as parking facilities to better accommodate a commuting student population. Alternative scenarios were evaluated to shape the best-choice plan.





RESULTS

A clearly ordered vision for continuing development included several project proposals that realigned facility program components to enhance and improve the functioning of curricular and co-curricular areas, particularly with respect to student activities and student services.
